



Title: Volunteer (Sailing)

Purpose:

The Trustees of Horizons are committed to advance the education and improve the quality of life of young people by providing experience of boating and related activities. Volunteers are recruited to assist the permanent staff operate and maintain the boats and administer activities. They have a vital part to play in helping Horizons encourage young people to widen their horizons

The role will likely entail the following tasks:

- Assisting with the delivery of on water sessions across a variety of vessels depending on experience and training
 - Schools Project (Keelboat sailing/crewing or safetyboat driving)
 - Club sailing sessions (Dinghy sailing, keelboat sailing, safetyboat driving/crewing)
 - Motorboat crewing
 - Shore based duties as required (manning shore base while sessions are on the water, or assisting with launching and recovery of vessels)
 - Assisting with delivery of RYA Sailing, or Powerboat courses
- Undertaking further training that is offered to increase knowledge and confidence
- Assisting with administration and maintenance tasks
- Observe Horizons Code of Conduct and follow relevant policies and procedures.
- Exercising a duty of care for other workers and members of the public.

Time scale:

The main sailing season runs from just after Easter until the end of October, during this time the Chief Instructor will manage the diary and will notify volunteers via a text messaging service of the opportunities that are available on a weekly basis.

We would envisage volunteers would be able to commit to at a minimum of one session a month in order to stay active and engaged, however we take a flexible approach to this.

Supervision:

Whilst volunteering on waterborne activities, volunteers will be under the direct supervision of the Senior Sailing Instructors and Lead Skippers. Volunteers should familiarise themselves with and adhere to the relevant policies and procedures.

Qualities:

- Team player
- Patient
- Good listener
- Sailing qualification are not essential but a willingness to learn would be essential
- Additional relevant experience that would be desirable
 - Previous sailing experience
 - working with young people
 - working with people from diverse backgrounds
 - Royal Yachting Association instructor qualifications

- Satisfaction derived from improving the situation of disadvantaged or disabled children that come to Horizons
- Training opportunities
 - Volunteers will have the opportunity to obtain relevant qualifications necessary for work afloat.
 - We can offer a range of sailing, powerboat and shore based courses to help you develop into your role as a volunteer.
 - Where possible, this training will be provided by Horizons.
 - This training will be provided free when funding is available or at the lowest cost possible.
